As part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe and healthy work environment at Toronto Pearson, we would like to remind the airport community of the following transportation modes and access routes to Terminal 1 and Terminal 3.

Getting to and from Pearson couldn't be easier, we are directly connected to regional transit lines and major highways. For your safety, you can take advantage of "One Fare" where riders will pay only once as they transfer between participating agencies in the Greater Toronto Area. Funded by the Ontario government, the One Fare program will make cross-boundary travel more affordable and convenient for commuters transferring between:

- GO Transit
- TTC
- Brampton Transit
- Durham Region Transit
- MiWay
- York Region Transit

Access Routes:

No pedestrian access is allowed in areas at Toronto Pearson that are not maintained as designated pedestrian walking routes. These areas with no pedestrian access are marked by "pedestrian's prohibited" signage.



Example: "Pedestrians Prohibited" signage where access of pedestrians is not permitted, and access is to vehicle only surfaces.

The wellbeing of the airport community is our top priority to health, safety, and security at Toronto Pearson. Therefore, you must comply with these rules and avoid areas identified with "pedestrians prohibited" signage for your personal safety and utilize the many modes of transportation that are available for both passengers and employees to access directly from the Terminals.
