On June 1, 2020 Directive #2020-D-005 "Mandatory Face Coverings and Airport Access Restrictions" was issued for Toronto Pearson. This Directive set mandatory requirements to be followed by all workers and passengers for the health and safety of everyone at Toronto Pearson.

The Directive states that:

"All passengers and airport workers must wear a face covering at all times when in public areas of the airport." "This includes the pre and post -security screening areas of the terminals, parking facilities, people mover train, sidewalks/curbs outside the terminals and other outdoor public areas."

"Access to the airport, including the terminal buildings, is limited to travelers disembarking from flights and departing travelers, and workers performing their work duties."

"Everyone using airport facilities must maintain 2 metres' physical distance whenever possible and wear a face covering."

"Airport workers must not dwell or loiter in terminal spaces and must not use seating inside the terminals."

In support of the above, please be advised there remains the expectation to comply and adhere to the above requirements by all persons attending to and working at Toronto Pearson.

Monitoring for adherence is in place and will continue. Persons identified as not meeting the requirements will be approached and requested to adhere before proceeding into or within the airport facilities.

Ensuring Toronto Pearson is the safest possible environment for workers and passengers is everyone's responsibility. Airport workers who notice travelers or fellow employees not observing the guidelines on face coverings, terminal access, physical distance and gathering and dwelling are asked to politely educate and encourage them to adhere to these requirements.
