The GTAA continues to be proactive at enhancing measures and implementing new initiatives and processes that support a healthy airport environment. Recent spikes in COVID-19 cases in the regions surrounding the airport and the announcements of new lockdowns in the communities where many airport employees live and work mean we need to exercise increased caution.

At this time, please consider renewed emphasis on existing COVID protocols and guidance in place at Toronto Pearson:

1. Wear a non-vented mask or face covering at all times when in any public areas of the airport, including terminals and curbs, or at any time when physical distance cannot be maintained.
2. Have in place a workplace contact tracing protocol to quickly identify, remove/self-isolate at home, educate, and support employees who have had close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.
3. Ensure that no employee who has tested positive for COVID -19 or has come into close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case continues to work at the Airport, unless they obtain a negative test result or are cleared by a medical professional or public health agency.

4. Employees working in the restricted area must complete a health certification every time they access the NPS checkpoint.
5. Maintain as few physical workplace contacts as possible, staying in their substantive work location and not mixing with other work teams' facilities like lunch or break rooms.
6. Avoid dwelling or loitering in terminal spaces and do not use seating inside the terminals
7. Monitor the [Toronto Pearson COVID-19 Case Log](#) for fuller understanding of the COVID-19 situation at Toronto Pearson.

COVID-19 spreads from in-person contact, and every person you interact with is a potential risk. Consider ways to minimize your local contacts, avoid social gatherings and keep your networks to your residence for lowest risk, whether your area is in lockdown or not.
