## Subject: New Passenger Flow Control Doors, Surrey Doors, and Employee Bypass- T1- Connections Corridor

On Monday, March 15, the new flow control doors located in the Terminal 1 connections corridor will be put into operation. See drawing below.

The three doors on the left will be used by employees and passengers who are proceeding to International ("E" Gates) as an originating or connecting passenger, or to Transborder ("F" Gates) as a connecting passenger. These doors will operate in one direction only.

The two doors on the right are primarily intended to support surrey traffic, however they may be used by employees with a valid need and right. To operate these doors, Surrey drivers will need to swipe their RAIC, enter their PIN, and press the button to enable an extended hold open. For employee flow, swiping their RAIC and entering their PIN will provide for single entry.

As always, it is the responsibility of the employee to ensure that the door is completely closed and secure after they have passed through.
