Subject: Screening of Persons and Items at Non-Passenger Screening-Vehicle (NPS-V) Screening Checkpoints

All vehicles, occupants and their belongings are subject to screening by the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (CATSA) when entering or remaining in the Critical Area of the airport. When directed, non-passengers **must present their person and all items** in their control or possession to CATSA for screening at the Non-Passenger Screening-Vehicle (NPS-V) Screening Checkpoints. Additionally, escorts **must** present all temporary pass holders under their control, and their personal items, to CATSA for screening.

To clarify, non-passengers are required to remove personal items, including employer issued items, from the vehicle and present them to CATSA for screening. This not only includes items that are in the passenger area of the vehicle, but also includes items in the trunk, cargo area, or rear exterior area of the vehicles. Personal items include, but not limited to, lunch boxes, purses, oversize liquids/aerosol/gels (LAGs), briefcases, laptop bags, backpacks, duty bags, suitcases, portable toolboxes, etc.

Items that need not be removed from the vehicle are: items subject to other security measures, such as supplies, catering or cargo (provided that they are accompanied by the appropriate documentation); items that cannot be removed from the vehicle; items that belong to the vehicle such as safety and emergency kits; and items that may be damaged by moving from the vehicle.

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in in a monetary penalty or the suspension, or cancellation of the Restricted Area Identity Card (RAIC).
