Subject: Toronto Pearson – Proof of vaccination/Exemption

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With the coming into force of the mandatory COVID-19 vaccination requirement for persons conducting activities on airport property, please be reminded that workers accessing the airport property, including the airport restricted area, must be fully vaccinated or have been issued an exemption by their employer prior to accessing the airport. Every airport worker must be able to demonstrate proof of vaccination, or in the case of a worker who has been granted an exemption, present Part 2 of the fully completed Transport Canada Exemption form.

The Greater Toronto Airports Authority (GTAA), as the operator of Toronto Pearson, will be conducting proof of vaccination checks throughout the airport property, whereas the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (CATSA) will be conducting checks at passenger and non-passenger screening points. When requested, the worker shall provide the documented proof of vaccination or exemption granted by their employer.

At the time of the request, if a worker is not able to provide documented proof of vaccination/exemption, then the worker may sign a declaration stating they are vaccinated, or have been granted an exemption, and have forgotten their documentation. The worker who signs a declaration will be required to present the documented proof to the GTAA within seven (7) days of the request or within their next attendance to the airport, whichever is the lesser time. Airport access privileges may be suspended if a

worker does not provide the documented proof to the GTAA within the identified time period.

A worker found to have accessed the airport property, including the airport restricted area, who has not been fully vaccinated or granted an exemption by their employer will have their access privileges suspended until such time as demonstrated to the GTAA, by their employer, that access can be reinstated.
