Subject: Screening of US bound non-Passengers

Expected Action: United States (US) bound travelers must always be screened by the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (CATSA) prior to entering the US preclearance area.

Background and Impact: In accordance with the Agreement on Land, Rail, Marine, and Air Transport Preclearance (LRMA) all travelers must be screened by CATSA. Travelers include passengers, flight crew, and other non-passengers (e.g., dead-heading flight crew) who are traveling to the US from a preclearance facility.

Flight crew departing from a preclearance facility on a US bound flight may use the passenger Transborder Pre-Board Screening (PBS) checkpoint or may use the Transborder Non-Passenger Screening (NPS) checkpoint (Terminal 1 only). When using the Transborder NPS checkpoint in Terminal 1 the crew member must **self-declare** to CATSA that they are travelling to the US and **must** undergo screening at the checkpoint.

Flight crew travelling on a US bound flight from a preclearance facility are no longer able to be randomized for screening when using the NPS checkpoint.

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Non-passengers who fail to abide by the LRMA requirements will be in non-compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the issuance of their RAIC which may result in the suspension and loss of RAIC privileges.
