

2024 CANADIAN AIRPORTS SAFETY WEEK
SAFETY CASH CAB and ONLINE ACTIVITIES CONTEST
CONTEST RULES

1. CONTEST PERIOD: The Safety Cash Cab and online activities contest (the “Contest”) begins September 23, 2024, at 0000 hours and ends at 2359 hours on September 29, 2024 (the “Contest Closing Date”). No purchase necessary. Only one entry per day regardless of the method of entry.

2. ELIGIBILITY: This Contest is open to all employees of the Greater Toronto Airports Authority (the “GTAA”) and the Toronto Pearson Community.

3. HOW TO ENTER: There are three (3) ways to enter:

- A. Enter the Safety Van, scan the QR Code and complete the entry form.
- B. Complete the online entry form
- C. Complete the following courses and send a picture of your completion certificate to at safety@gtaa.com.

Environmental Awareness or Facility Control and Evacuation Procedures

Questions will change daily during the Contest based on the safety theme of the day.

Odds of winning depend on the number of Eligible Entries received as of the Contest Closing Date. By entering this Contest, entrants agree to be bound by these Contest Rules and by the decisions of the GTAA, which shall be final on all matters relating to this Contest. The GTAA is not responsible for late, invalid, illegible, incomplete, or misdirected entries. All entries become the property of the GTAA and will not be returned.

4. PRIZE: Six (6) \$100 gift cards to be won.

Prizes must be accepted as awarded and are not transferable or exchangeable for cash. The GTAA reserves the right to substitute a Prize, in whole or in part, with a prize of at least equal value in the event of the unavailability, for whatever reason, of the advertised Prize.

5. RANDOM DRAWS: Random draws will be held on October 11, 2024 (the “Draw Date”) from among all Eligible Entries received as of the Contest Closing Date. The selected entrants will be notified by email on October 14, 2024. If a selected entrant (i) cannot be reached within two (2) business days following the first attempt of contact; (ii) is no longer an employee of the GTAA or working at the Airport; or (iii) declines the Prize, the selected entrant will be disqualified and another entrant will be randomly selected from the remaining Eligible Entries.

6. PRIZE PICK UP: Winners will be contacted to arrange for prize pick-up at the Airway Centre.

7. GENERAL RULES: The GTAA is not responsible for lost, interrupted or unavailable network servers or other connections, miscommunications, or other errors of any kind whether human, mechanical or electronic. All entrants release and forever discharge the GTAA and its officers, directors and employees from all claims, demands, damages, actions, and causes of action arising or to arise by reason of his/her

participation in the Contest and/or the administration of the Contest, including, without limitation, the selection and awarding of the Prizes. The GTAA shall in no way bear any liability whatsoever regarding the Prizes. In no event shall the GTAA be liable for any special, incidental, consequential, indirect, or punitive damages arising out of or in connection with this Contest and/or the Prizes, however arising, including negligence.

8. DISQUALIFICATION: Persons found tampering with or abusing any aspect of this Contest, as determined by the GTAA, will be disqualified. In the event any portion of this Contest is compromised by virus, bugs, non-authorized human intervention, or other causes beyond the control of the GTAA, which, in the sole opinion of the GTAA, corrupts, or impairs the administration, security, fairness or proper submission into the Contest, the GTAA reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to suspend or terminate this Contest. Any entrant found tampering with or undermining the Contest will be disqualified.

9. TAXABLE BENEFIT: The Prizes awarded to the winning GTAA employees are deemed a taxable benefit pursuant to the Canada Revenue Agency and all applicable taxes shall be paid by the winning GTAA employees.
