## EMPLOYEE WINTER SAFETY



Prevent slips, trips and falls. Did you know that in 2016, 11,495 lost time injury (LTI) claims were due to falls in the workplace? 65% of those injuries were from falls on the same level. It is particularly important in the winter that you are prepared and have the appropriate footwear. Do you have the correct footwear? - this means winter boots for office workers and anti-slip footwear for outdoor workers. Be prepared and wear all the appropriate equipment your employer has provided.

Check your work area. Be aware! Whether in an office environment, on the ramp, in a crew room, around check-in counters, or on the airfield – always check for trip hazards. Consider how you can take the lead in your workplace to keep employees and visitors safe.

Hold the handrails. It might seem silly to be reminded, but simply holding the handrail when going up and down stairs and escalators can prevent serious injury. Never try to carry large items up and down stairs or on escalators. Be patient - don't rush.

Don't text while walking or driving. Be attentive! Turn off your autopilot. Stay alert to stay safe. Accidents can happen in an instant. Safe operations demand your full attention.

Walk carefully on icy, slippery surfaces. Apply sand where possible and report slippery conditions by calling the Toronto Pearson Snow Desk at 416-776-3153.

## Winter Ramp Safety Starts with You!

Snow removal crews cannot be everywhere at once during a snow event. Here is what you can do to help maintain safe operations. In order to ensure the safe and effective operation on the apron and gate areas during a winter weather event, employees working on the ramp should do the following:

- Park all ground support equipment (GSE) within designated parking locations, unless otherwise requested by snow removal crews in preparation for gate snow clearing operations, and relocate unused GSE off the apron area. Ensure brakes are engaged on all GSE.
- Do not leave wheel chocks, pylons, and bins on the ground in the gate area.
- Ensure the passenger boarding bridges (PBB) are returned to the circles after the aircraft has pushed back.
- Securely stow the pre-conditioned air (PCA) hoses in their baskets.
- Stow the potable water hoses within their cabinets, shut off the water supply, and secure the cabinet doors. Do not overfill the aircraft with water.
- Retract and stow the visual docking guidance system (VDGS) cables.
- Use the sand bins that are provided at the gate as a first measure for slippery conditions around the gate areas. If the area has been chemically treated, allow the opportunity for the treatment to take effect. Be mindful of the ground conditions when walking on the ramp and ensure appropriate winter footwear is worn.
- Give way to snow removal equipment and drive according to the road conditions.
- Tire chains will be permitted but must be removed 24 hours after the event has ended.
- If an aircraft returns to the gate after being deiced and the glycol is creating overly slippery conditions on the ramp, please report this to the GTAA Snow Desk at 416-776-3153\*.


