
LOCK THEN WALK


Unauthorized movement of passengers and employees between security areas has become a serious concern. These incidents could impact and inconvenience our airlines and passengers by causing flight delays.

Here's how you can help prevent incidents from happening:

What you need to do:

- Swipe your RAIC every time it is required.
- When going through a secure door, always make sure you push or pull it closed until it locks before walking away.
- Some doors have closers that cause them to close slowly, which can allow the opportunity for someone to go through if the door is unattended.
- Never allow anyone to piggyback through a door where you have had to swipe your RAIC to unlock it.
- Do your part in promoting a culture of security and reporting.
