4.0 MEMBERS UPDATE

- Committee members reported on each of their areas.
- **Seneca College – Savik Ramkay**
 - Seneca College, along with several other colleges, have made the decision not to intake flight students in the fall due to the current student backlog of 4 years. Jobs in the aviation sector for most graduating students have been significantly reduced. The biggest challenge facing the college will be obtaining visas for international students. 80 per cent of the courses at Seneca College has been moved to online.
- **Transport Canada – Ludovic D’Sousa**
 - Transport Canada continues to work with the Public Health Agency of Canada, other levels of government and all stakeholders to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19. Transport Canada’s approach and the measures taken in the aviation sector are listed on the Transport Canada website. Transport Canada has issued several interim orders for the aviation sector and will continue to do so based on engagement with our stakeholders in the aviation sector.
