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## 1.0 DISCUSSION ITEMS

## 1.1 90 Day Weather Review – Conference Call

- T. Lennox invited CC Members to hear the results of the 90 day Weather Review via conference call.
- As a result of the review, twelve recommendations were made which were categorized in three areas,
  - o Toronto Pearson to be far better prepared for irregular operations.
  - o Spend more time on issues of communication and internal

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communication with respect to arriving passengers.

- Provide improved amenities and services to passengers at Toronto Pearson.

- J. Nevins inquired if Toronto Pearson had an emergency response plan for extreme heat or a severe lightning storm. T. Lennox responded the GTAA has always had an emergency response plan with Transport Canada in order to maintain an operator's license. It is broken into categories which includes lightning storms, winter events and in the extreme heat of the summer months as the apron can become very hot.
- S. Tufts noted many of the recommendations in the report are under the purview
  of the GTAA. Will the airlines be taking some responsibility for the wellbeing of
  their passengers. T. Lennox responded that the GTAA wanted to ensure it could
  make improvements to many of these areas but some of the recommendations
  do speak to the partners, and the GTAA is working together with Air Canada,
  WestJet and the ground handlers.
- S. Tufts commented he has spoken to many of the Toronto Pearson employees and the 90 day review recommendations have been broadly supported by all union workers.
- D. Albanese inquired what was the dominant factor that caused the ground stop at Toronto Pearson. T. Lennox responded it was a combination of weather events that took place over the course of several days that caused airline schedules to be disrupted. Toronto Pearson was also accepting diversions from other airports.
