

Removal of mandatory hotel stay and quarantine for fully vaccinated (July 2021)

US residents permitted for nonessential travel (August 2021)

All nationals permitted for non-essential travel (September 2021)

Removal of global non-essential travel advisory (October 2021)



Mandatory postarrival testing of all travellers removed (August 2021)
