2.	Resident Maria Fernandez inquired about the delay in the flight path changes over Malton.	Aviation Strategies International (ASI) advises they are on target for June 27 publication date in the Canada Air Pilot (CAP) that should see a correction to the problem over Malton.	Complete
3.	B. Green inquired with the recent change to the flight path over Malton how much further north will the aircraft be flying before they initiate the turn.	Aircraft currently climb to an altitude of 1,100 feet prior to commencing their heading adjustment. With the altitude adjustment to 1,600 feet aircraft should now steer clear of Malton (about 1 mile further north from the current point).	Complete
