


DECEMBER 2015






Propeller Aircraft Turns	Early Jet Turns					
 Propeller aircraft are permitted to turn to course shortly after takeoff from any runway between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. This is standard procedure since the 1970s. During the trial, prop turns are also permitted until 11:30 p.m. and from 6:30 a.m. 	 Certain small jet aircraft are permitted to turn to course shortly after takeoff on the east/west runways between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. This is standard procedure since 2005. During the trial, early turns are also permitted on the north/ south runways.
