

Why are we updating our plan?



Our lease requires that we manage a "First class, major international airport that meets the demands for capacity".

The GTAA is required to update its Master Plan every 10 years, as outlined in its ground lease with Transport Canada.

Global and regional demand for air travel requires growth at Toronto Pearson. A 20-year Master Plan will guide us as we grow.



Master Plan Engagement Activities



More than 7,000 residents engaged in conversations about our growth and signed up for Master Plan updates

535 community members attended five public workshops in surrounding communities

2,500 individuals completed a survey on Airport Growth

36 residents, selected from across the region, comprised Toronto Pearson Residents'
Reference Panel, providing advice on the airport's responsible growth

45 community events throughout the region








Existing runways will continue to handle the projected demand over the next twenty years



Toronto Pearson's aircraft movement growth continues to be in line with GTA population growth







Land Use Plan

Minimal changes from the previous Land Use Plan

- Addition of ~30 ha of Boeing Lands at Derry and Airport Roads
- 2. Regional Transit Centre and processor
- North and midfield terminal expansion options protected
- 4. Phased terminal expansion including additional gates, more baggage capacity, with eventual single contiguous terminal
- 5. Plan still protects for sixth runway but does not anticipate a new runway is needed to accommodate capacity
